

Therefore he is to be worshipped as God.	 be introduced to the overall aim of the course search various passages to see that the Holy Spirit is a person who is God see that because he is God, the Spirit should be worshipped.
2 The Spirit is about Jesus with intensity	To see that the Spirit's main role and agenda is to point people to, and show them, Jesus.	 think about jobs and roles see that the Spirit comes from the Father and Son know that the job and role of the Spirit is to glorify Jesus.
3 You can be saved for eternity	To see that Jesus teaches that the only way to be a Christian is to be born again by the Holy Spirit.	 consider their own births, and how they were not involved in them hear that Jesus said to Nicodemus that one must be born again consider how Christians can be grateful to God because he is the one who enables us to be born again.
4 Christians are loved with security	To see that the Spirit is an inheritance that gives great assurance to Christians that they will persevere to the end.	 understand that in the Old Testament the Spirit came on special people for a time read some prophecies about the Spirit coming in the New Testament, and how he comes in Acts see that the Spirit never leaves Christians, and as a result they can have great assurance that God will never leave them.
5 The Bible is speaking with clarity	To see that the Spirit has spoken, inspired, and continues to speak through the Bible.	 learn how the Old Testament was written by the prophets as they were carried along by the Spirit understand that Jesus promised that the Spirit would help the Apostles to remember all that he taught them, and they wrote it down know that the Spirit is still speaking through the Bible.
6 Ask God for things without timidity	To see that prayer is only possible because the Spirit speaks on our behalf.	 understand that Christians are children of God, and can therefore ask him for things learn about the Spirit's role in prayer examine the Lord's Prayer as a model for their personal prayers.

7 Tell others about Jesus with sincerity	To see that the Spirit is on a mission to spread the news of Jesus, and we can be part of that mission.	 think about what they are afraid of see how the Spirit gave power to leaders in the Old Testament look at how the Spirit gave the early followers, and gives Christians today, power to tell others about Jesus.
8 Got to church with unity	To see that the church is where the Spirit lives today and so regular attendance is important and promotes unity amongst believers.	 consider their own church experiences see the role of the Spirit in the church today as he teaches, unifies and prays think through how they might make church a priority in their timetable.
9 Use your gufts to serve with humility	To see that our gifts and abilities should be used to serve others for the common good as the Spirit empowers us.	 think about what gifts they have and how they can use them understand that gifts come from the Holy Spirit see that our gifts are to be used to serve others for their good, not our own.
10 Fight sin to reach maturity	To see that change is possible, by the power of the Spirit, to become more like Jesus.	 think about their strengths and weaknesses, and how they'd like to change see the conflict in the Christian between the Spirit and their flesh consider how they might keep in step with the Spirit to be more like Jesus.





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
